### Indigenous Health Equity

**Presentation Summary:** This presentation will provide foundational knowledge regarding Indigenous health equity in Canada. It will explore the history and ongoing impacts of racism and colonialism as key determinants of Indigenous health. By the end of the session, participants will be able to navigate practical tools that relate to Indigenous health equity. Some of these tools will include anti-racism, cultural humility, cultural safety, and trauma-informed practices. Finally, the presentation will address how healthcare providers can leverage their position of privilege to address Indigenous health inequities at a systemic level.



**Dr. Brent Young**

*Dr. Brent Young (helhim/nek̓m) is an Anishinaabe family physician and the academic director for Indigenous health at Dalhousie Medical School. He has recently been working on a new Indigenous Admissions Pathway and developing sustainable support programs for an increased number of Indigenous people who will be joining the medical profession. He is also working with the Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre to develop culturally safe and relevant primary care services for the urban Indigenous population in the Halifax region. Dr. Young is committed to helping other healthcare providers navigate the complexities of decolonization, anti-racism, and reconciliation.*
